

Q5 Did you take call as a fellow?













Q12 If yes, did you honor your commitment?





Q13 Did you secure your job during your fellowship?





Q14 How many job interviews did you go on to find your job?









Q22 At the start of your practice, what percentage do you anticipate being devoted to shoulder & elbow?




